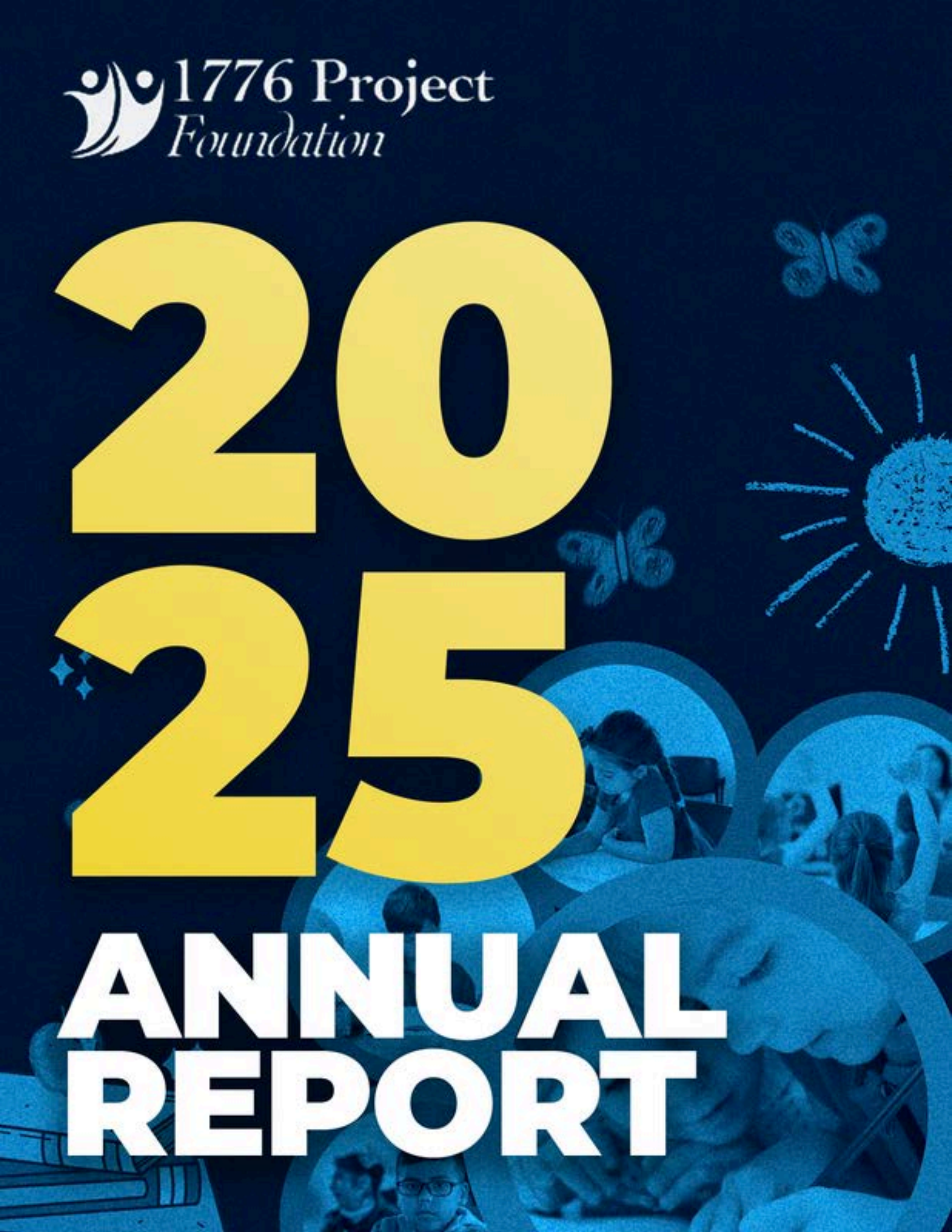

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Last year, the 1776 Project Foundation **officially launched**, but truthfully, the **groundwork had been laid for years before that**. Hundreds of parents, grandparents, and concerned community members ran for school board during and after the COVID-19 pandemic, where mask mandates and lockdowns dominated the conversation.

Years later, America is still **dealing with the consequences**. The pandemic, and the federal funds to smooth its impact, temporarily bloated budgets, sticking many new board members with a fiscal crisis, rampant absenteeism, and **declining performance across the board**.

We believe that this can and must be reversed. The vast majority, over 80 percent, of all students in America attend public schools. The country **cannot afford to cede such a vital institution to an ideologically hostile pedagogy**, nor can it afford a generation or more of Americans who hardly know how to read or write, let alone engage in our civic life.

Thomas Jefferson wrote that the object of primary education was “To instruct the mass of our citizens in these their rights, interests and duties, as men and citizens,” **which we believe is vital to the health and continuation of our republican system of governance**.

At the 1776 Project, **we’ve spent the last year developing programs that truly engage with and advise board members in a way that turns them into effective advocates and policymakers** for this vision. The future of this country isn’t decided in Washington or state capitols. It starts in the local public schools, and the values imparted to our children for eight hours a day, five days a week, for 12 years.

Our board members are engaged, and because of them, **the 1776 Project has had an outsized impact on school board policy and over half a million students**.

We’re only just getting started.

MISSION:

The **mission** of the 1776 Project Foundation is to create and disseminate policies that will promote academic achievement and revitalize our educational system for families and students across the nation.

VISION:

The **vision** of the 1776 Project Foundation is a fully revitalized educational system in which public schools effectively serve families and children of all backgrounds and restore academic excellence to its rightful place as a primary goal of education.

The Need for Principled School Board Leadership:

Our public schools have failed parents and students for decades, with student scores declining or plateauing despite a 300 percent increase in spending per student (adjusted for inflation). After the pandemic lockdowns of 2020-21, **the need for dramatic change has only become clearer:** student performance has cratered, absenteeism is through the roof, parents and students are increasingly worried about violence both in and out of the classroom while politicians and activists treat our schools as laboratories for their radical ideas.

While some call to dismantle the entire system, we believe the answer is to restore public education by organizing, preparing, and supporting reform-focused board members to lead in this moment of change.

Parents want, and deserve, the best possible education for their children. They want high standards and they want politics out of the classroom. Most importantly, parents want the district to **treat them as customers and partners rather than as enemies.**

We need school boards with principled leaders dedicated and empowered to advance academic excellence, not radical ideologies. With you by our side, **the 1776 Project Foundation will equip and empower the next generation of school board leaders to effectively advance policies directed toward academic excellence** in America's 13,200+ public school districts. This is how we are going to accomplish this mission.

The ranks of reform-minded school district board members are rapidly increasing in America. They need support, guidance, and research-based policy that will support their reform initiatives, restoring academic achievement the top priority of our school system.

The day-long event aimed to help school board members develop a framework of principles to both **unleash innovation and protect their students from harm.**

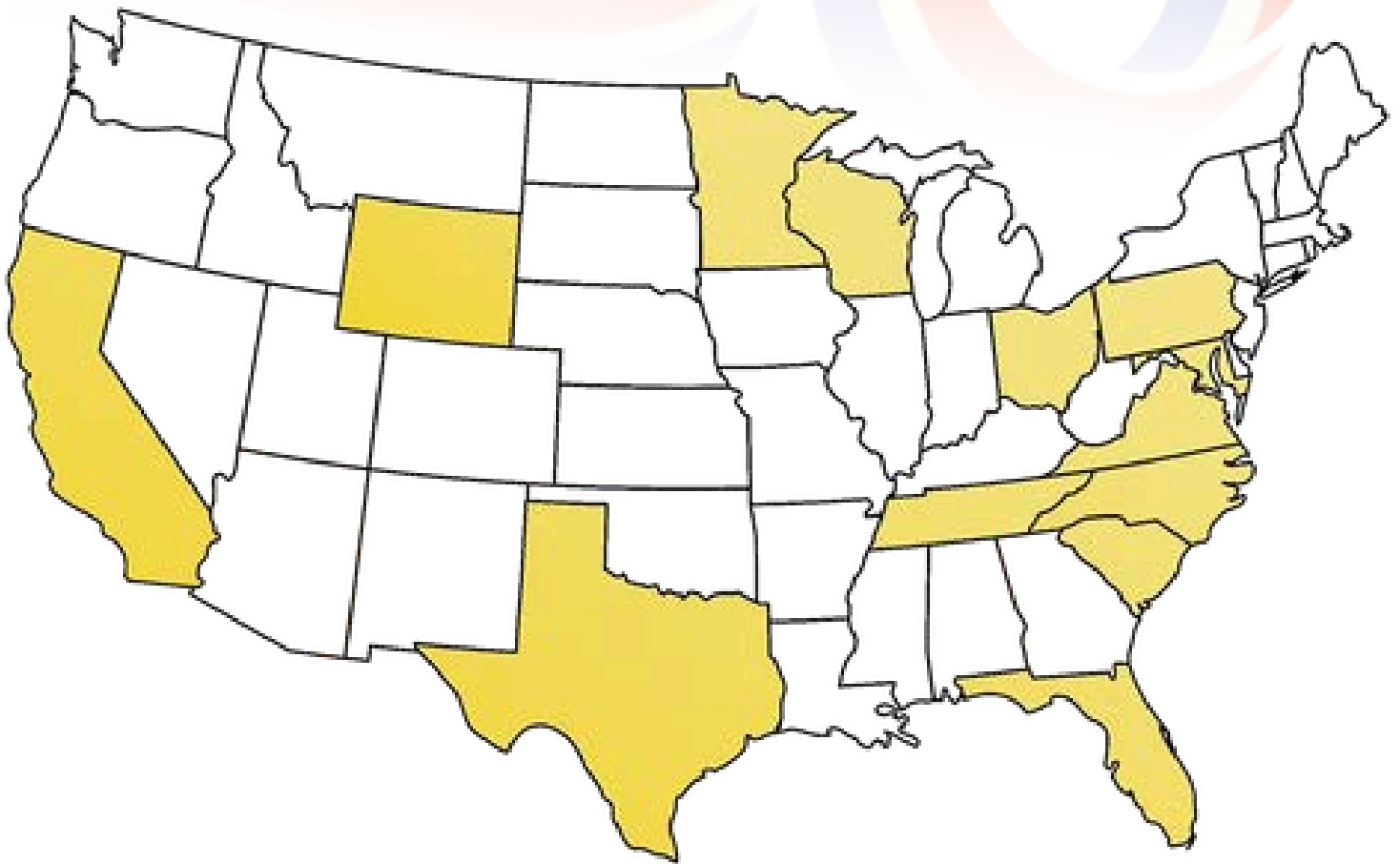

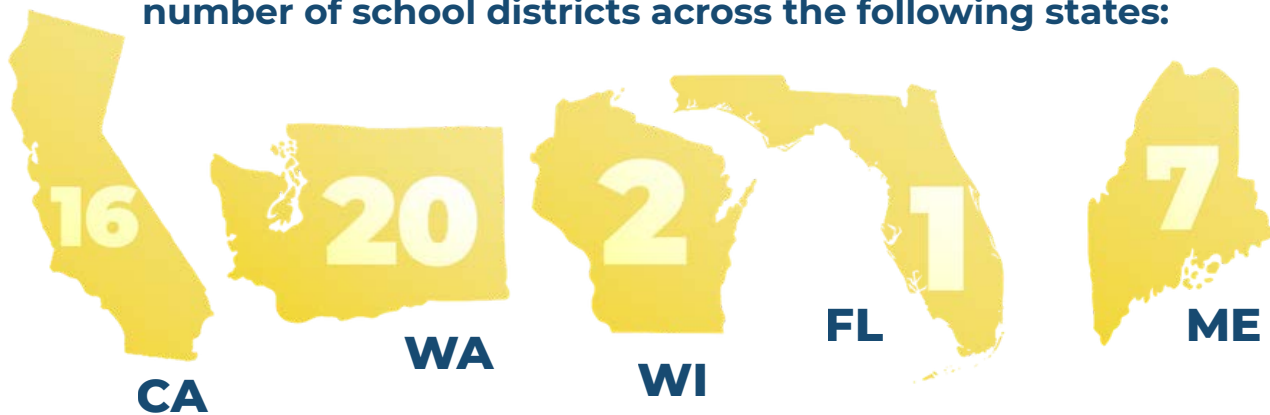
